On October 8, James Lee "Reb" Brant passed away at the Israel Family Hospice Home in Ames, Iowa. He was just 82 years young and had only a day before entered hospice care. What a jolt of sadness Lee's sudden passing was to family and his many, many friends, especially the Heartland Sundae Riders. We already miss Reb terribly, and decided to dedicate this issue to his memory. I'll stick to my editorial

role, posting many of our favorite Reb memories in this special issue, except for two vignettes that seem to sum up my own friendship with this great man:

When I mentioned Lee's passing to our oldest daughter, Andrea (now 38) and to twins Liz and Mark (now 34), they weren't immediately aware of whom I was speaking. "You remember," I added, "The fellow you always called *Mister Fun*."

That's when recognition and grieving came to them as well. Lee enjoyed a close kinship with our youngest members, as our three enjoyed in this photo from three decades ago. (thanks for the pic, Laura)

But my favorite visual memory of Lee was in Mackinaw City at the 1988 Lemans National Rally, watching at a distance with Mary Ann and several others

while Reb, astride his Cavalcade, mischievously eyed a large flock of seagulls gathered in a nearby parking lot (as gulls often do). After a moment to appreciate that scene of avian serenity, solidarity and beauty, Lee suddenly dropped the clutch and, with his famous crow-caw horn blaring loudly, splashed his heavy 'Cade headlong into the flock, dramatically scattering a hundred white seabirds to the Four Winds and eliciting shock and delight from those witnessing the spectacle. *Mr. Fun indeed!* (Lee knew, I'm sure, that gulls are responsive to approaching threats and none would be harmed by his marauding corvine attack.) Memorial for Reb—Members Write...

I'd like to share a very short video that I captured at Reb's "Celebration Of Life" service. To prep the video a bit, I can safely say that there were at least 5 different local EMT/Firefighter units from surrounding communities...and most likely more than just the 5 teams that I counted. The church was beyond packed with friends, family, coworkers, neighbors, and several Heartland Sundae Road Riders.

Several attendees shared emotional stories about their relationship with our dear Reb, including Darryl Jorpeland and Scooter Winkelman from our group.

At one point during the COL, several EMT/Firefighters scattered themselves throughout the church with their handheld radios turned up so that everyone could easily hear the "Final Call To Duty" salute to Reb. Words fail to describe the emotions.

When the COL was completed inside the church, everyone was asked to step outside for a few more final ceremonial events. Upon the completion of the Honor Guard's gun salute the playing of the American Taps, the American flag was presented to Tiara and family along with other memorial items.

With several ambulances and fire trucks lined up for two city blocks, along with many Jeeps from Reb's Jeep club. Reb was placed into one of the fire trucks for one final ride. The procession left the church, circled around town, and then finally made their way back to the church.

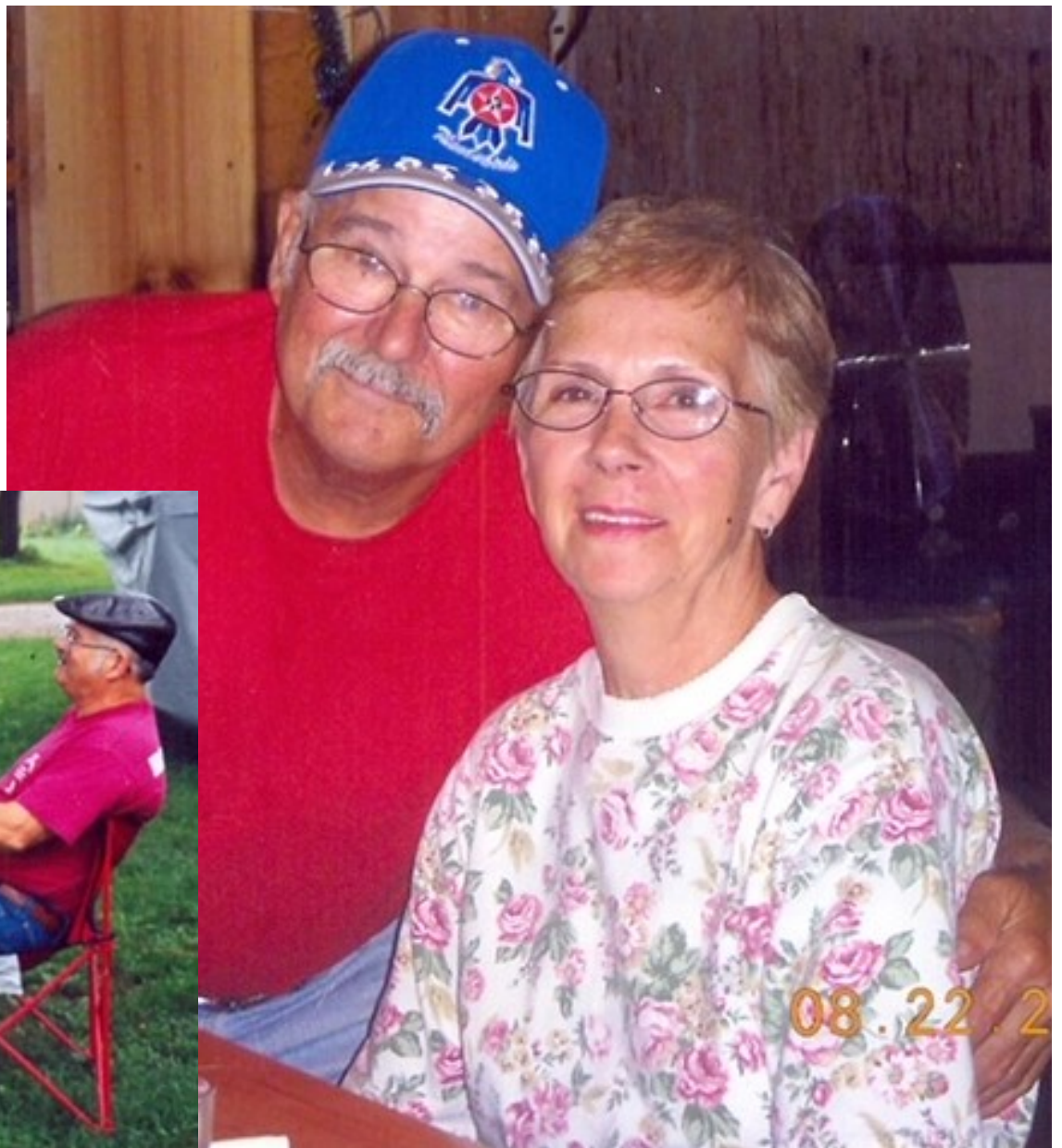
